POISONOUS TO RABBITS

PLANTS, poisonous if eaten.

Aloe Vera, Amaryllis, Anemone, Avocado leaves, Azalea, Bluebells, Buttercup, Bittersweet, Bryony, Caladium, Carnation, Clematis, Columbine, Cyclamen, Daffodil, Devil's Ivy, Dieffenbachia, Dracaena, Fig, Foxglove, Geranium, Holly, Hyacinth, Hydrangea, Impatiens, Iris, Ivy, Laburnum, Leyland Cypress, Lily of the Valley, Jerusalem Cherry, Juniper, Lupins, Lobelia, Marsh Marigold, Mistletoe, Morning Glory, Narcissus, Nightshade, Oleander, Onion, Peony, Philodendron, Primrose, Privet, Rhododendron, Rubber Plant, Schefflera, Spurnes, St. Johns Wort, Wisteria, Yew

FOODS YOU SHOULD NOT FEED

Chocolate

Grains

Cereals, yeast, biscuits, crackers, bread, pasta,

Onions and garlic

Salty or sugary snacks

Fungi - mushrooms that are poisonous to humans are also toxic to dogs.

Alcohol

Corn

White sugar

HOUSEHOLD ITEMS, poisonous if eaten or otherwise inhaled

Antifreeze, Aspirin, Bleach, Boric Acid, Brake Fluid, Cleaning Fluids, Deodorants, Deodorisers, Detergents, Disinfectants, Drain Cleaner, Dye, Fungicides, Furniture Polish, Hair colourings, Herbicides, Insecticides, Kerosene, Laxatives, Lead, Matches, Metal Polish, Moth Balls, Petrol, Nail Varnish and Remover, Paint and Remover, Perming solutions, Phenol, Rat poison, Rubbing Alcohol, Shoe Polish, Sleeping Pills, Soap, Suntan lotions, Tar, Tinsel, Turpentine, Woodstains.

Always contact the surgery if your rabbit has eaten human medication of any kind or another animal's medication.

WHAT TO DO IN THE CASE OF POISONING

Contact the surgery for immediate advice. Bring your rabbit to the surgery and also bring the poisonous substance/container. We need specific details from the labeling to determine the course of action needed. It is also helpful to know the quantity consumed. Do not wait and see how the animal is, always act immediately even if the rabbit initially shows no symptoms.
